#### A word from the principal and welcome to the sixth week of term 4

He also had the students practise the "Get Down Low & Go Go Go" procedure for avoiding smoke inhalation in an enclosed room. The students also practised the "Stop, Drop and Roll" procedure to minimise burning, if clothing catches fire.

Yesterday's Remembrance Day ceremony was important for all of our students. It gave us the opportunity to reflect upon those who have suffered in wars and to value our country as a safe one to reside in.
